a mini reading transformation pack for exploring various book genres







### WHAT IS BOOK BAKERY DAY?

This is a mini pack to help you transform your classroom into a pretend "reading genre bakery" called Book Bakery! To put it simply, this is a little pack to help give a fun theme to the experience of exploring a variety of reading genres for your students! It encourages them to explore and read books in genres that they may otherwise not initiate themselves. This theme day helped my students find book genres that they didn't even know they LOVED! The pack includes a reading craftivity to help your students record what they read during the book bakery, genre mini signs, genre posters, bookmarks, and an additional no-prep alternative response template if you don't have time for the craftivity. The pack also includes all of the EASY ways I incorporated Book Bakery into my own classroom, with links to optional materials, lesson plans, and set-up tips! Our theme day took us no more than an hour to an hour and a half, but you could certainly keep the fun going for as little or as long as you'd like. Book Bakery can be created using the books you already have in your classroom library. 000 Your students will love this thematic reading mini pack!

#### **SETTING UP**

After setting out the tablecloths, I placed a mini genre sign and a pile of books from that genre on each table. To make the morning more festive and novel, I placed each pile of books on top of a cake stand or a dessert stands. A pile of the coordinating cupcakes for each genre was also placed on the table. For example, at the biography table, I included a mini biography sign and a pile of biography books.

At each student's table spot, I placed an empty box of cupcakes and a pile of the cupcake templates for that genre. (Example: The biography table included a mini biography sign, a pile of biography cupcake templates, and a pile of biography books.)







TIP: How did you choose which books to pull for each genre? My goal for this lesson was to expose the students to various book genres – NOT for them to read every book on the table with 100% accuracy. I chose books that were on or around my class's independent reading level. I also put books below reading level at the time so that my students who had not yet reached grade level could participate and have access to the books.

Each group started with one of the five genres. The students had time to explore, read, and flip through the books at their tables. Each student chose one book from the pile to read and explore. He or she then cut out a cupcake (you can have them already cut to save time if you wish) and drew a picture of what the book was all about. (For older students, you can have them write what the books were mostly about on the cupcakes.) The student then added this cupcake to his or her cupcake box. After about 6-8 minutes, I rang the bell, and the students moved to the next table/genre. Each time the students moved to a new tables/genres, they brought their cupcake boxes with them. They repeated this procedure for each genre, adding a coordinating cupcake to their bakery boxes at each table.


#### **BOOK BAKERY CRAFTIVITY**


















#### **ALTERNATE NO-PREP CRAFTIVITY**

For most teachers, time is precious. You may not have the time (or energy) to print each genre cupcake and then have your students cut out their pieces. If you lack the time or resources to have students cut out individual cupcakes for their bakery boxes, I've included two "just print" cupcake pages you can use as alternatives.

Simply print out the cupcake printable that works for you. Your students can simply color a picture of each book they read on the recording sheet instead of cutting out the cupcakes. This saves time and still provides your students with a cute recording sheet for each genre they explore. Due to this template being a no-prep and time-saving version of the activity, I've included only the five main genres that I used during my own Book Bakery Day: fantasy, realistic fiction, biography, nonfiction, and poetry. The sixth cupcake allows students to reflect on their favorite books and draw pictures of them. \*You could also print this one page out for each child, and he or she can cut out his or her own six cupcakes to use during the rotations.


There is also a template that includes the five book genres listed above, plus an empty cupcake that you can write on if you wish to add a sixth genre to this sheet.


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#### **BOOK BAKERY BOOKMARKS**

The bookmarks on the following page can be printed on cardstock and cut out for students to use during independent reading, partner reading time, small-group time, and more! You can print them out on white paper and allow students to refer to the bookmarks when they are identifying a books' genres as they read. For this bookmark, I've chosen five popular genres to refer to. If you need additional genres added, just have students write them on the backs of the bookmarks.

\*An additional idea is to have students color cupcakes beside the genres they read independently. Their goal would be to read one book from every genre to complete their "Book Bakery Bookmark Mission".

These bookmarks also make excellent reading tools to send home. They will help parents help their children identify the books' genres during nightly reading! Enjoy!






