
FEBRUARY READ & INFER THE VALENTINE'S DAY MIX-UP

MEET THE LUNCH BUNCH CLUB!

Join Sam, Sara, Mike, Lee, Theo, Wendy, Darcy, and May in this fun inference series! These eight friends love having lunch together at school, but sometimes, things at Kind Elementary School get MIXED UP! In each inference pack, your students will help the Lunch Bunch Club solve a big problem by using their own schema and clues from the text to make inferences. Can your students help the Lunch Bunch Club friends by working together to be literacy detectives? With each pack, your students will learn more and more about the members of the Lunch Bunch Club. My hope is that your students come to know these eight characters as "old pals" within your classroom. I just know you and your students will have a blast with this resource! At the same time, they will build important literacy skills as they infer, draw conclusions, make predictions, write about their reading and reasoning, and think critically.



The Valentine's Day Mix-Up

Friendship is in the air at Kind Elementary School! The Lunch Bunch Club kids are so excited for the big Valentine's Day party. Each member made little goodie bags to pass out to their friends at the party. They filled the bags with special treats or toys. They also wrote Valentine's Day cards to go with their goodie bags so that everyone would know which goodie bag each friend was passing out. Like always, there was a little mix-up that caused a BIG problem! The members of the Lunch Bunch Club forgot to tape their cards onto their goodie bags. Now no one knows who the goodie bags are from! Can you help the Lunch Bunch Club? Read each Valentine's Day card carefully. Use your schema (what you already know) and clues from the text to figure out which goodie bag each friend in the Lunch Bunch Club brought to the Valentine's Day party. When you find the match, place the picture of the treat into the correct goodie bag so that everyone will know who it is from. Good luck!

CAN YOUR STUDENTS HELP THE LUNCH BUNCH CLUB?

The Valentine's Day party at Kind Elementary School is today! The members of the Lunch Bunch Club brought goodie bags to pass out to their friends. They each wrote a Valentine's Day card to go with their goodie bags, but they forgot to tape the cards to the bags! Now their goodie bags are all mixed up. Can you read the cards to figure out which goodie bag each member of the Lunch Bunch Club made to pass out? Use your schema and clues from the text to help you infer!



EXTEND THE LEARNING WITH A WRITING PROJECT!

Let the learning and fun continue with an extended writing project! Each child will draw a picture of a treat or toy they would want to fill their goodie bag with for the party. Then, your students will write a Valentine's Day card that gives clues about what is in the goodie bag. Your little learners will love putting their comprehension skills to the test as they make inferences about which goodie bag each friend in their classroom brought to the Valentine's Day party!
