Join Sam, Sara, Mike, Lee, Theo, Wendy, Darcy, and May in this fun inference series! These eight friends love having lunch together at school - but sometimes, things at Kind Elementary School get MIXED UP! In each inference pack, your students will help the Lunch Bunch Club solve a big problem by using their own schema and clues from the text to make inferences. Can your students help the Lunch Bunch Club friends by working together to be literacy detectives? With each pack, your students will learn more and more about the members of the Lunch Bunch Club. My hope is that your students come to know these eight characters as "old pals" within your classroom. I just know you and your students will have a blast with this resource! At the same time, they will build important literacy skills as they infer, draw conclusions, make predictions, write about their reading and reasoning, and think critically.



The Snow Globe Mix-Up



Inside the snow globe, they got to draw a place they would like to visit one day. In Mrs. Hill's writing class, the students wrote a report about where they want to go. However, Mrs. Hill forgot to tell the kids to give their reports a title, so nobody wrote the name of the place they want to go on their paper. Now, the reports and the snow globe pictures are all mixed up! Can you help the Lunch Bunch Club? Read each report carefully. Use your schema (what you already know), and clues from the text, to figure out where each member of the Lunch Bunch Club wants to visit one day. When you find the match, place the picture of the place in the correct snow globe so that Mrs. Hill and Mr. Ron can hang them up in the hallway. Good luck!

CAN YOUR STUDENTS HELP THE LUNCH BUNCH CLUB?







Winter inference riddles make a great addition to your mini lessons, small group work, or literacy centers for the month of January. Differentiated




