
# **MEET THE LUNCH BUNCH CLUB!**

Can your students help the Lunch Bunch Club friends by working together to be literacy detectives? With each pack, your students will learn more and more about the members of the Lunch Bunch Club. My hope is that your students come to know these eight characters as "old pals" within your classroom. I just know you and your students will have a blast with this resource! At the same time, they will build important literacy skills as they infer, draw conclusions, make predictions, write about their reading and reasoning, and think critically.



## CAN YOUR STUDENTS HELP THE LUNCH BUNCH CLUB?




### **EXTEND THE LEARNING WITH A WRITING PROJECT!**



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


