



ideas For when to use the reading reference pages

- during small-group reading instruction
- while lesson planning
- as a reference for parent-teacher conferences
- for ideas on comprehension questions to ask
- while administering and scoring a running record
- as a reference tool for your teacher binder
- during literacy coaching sessions
- while creating anchor charts for comprehension
- as a resource for a new teacher or student teacher
- to print the comprehension questions and place on a ring for parents to use during nightly reading

Printing and assembly TIPS FOR THE READING REFERENCE RING

You can choose to print all of the pages or only the ones that you would like to use. The pages are available in a smaller version and as full-size pages.

To print your pages in a smaller size for a book ring, print the pages that contain two reference sheets on one page. Cut the pages out and laminate if you wish. Hole punch the top left corner of each page, and arrange the pages on a book ring. Book rings can be found online and in general classroom supply stores. The book ring can then be clipped into your lesson planning binder, hung on the wall, or put into a basket.

Full-size versions of the reference pages are available, too. You can use a three-hole punch for the full-size versions, and add these pages into your reading binder, data binder, lesson planning binder, etc.




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
