The following pages contain the exact same practice pages as the previous ones, but they are without the primary writing lines. These pages contain regular lines for students to write on.


For differentiation, encourage students to write more than one sentence to go with the quote. You can use the page as a jumping off point for a story.

## **A MINI BOOK**

The following four pages contain the template for a short, half-page mini book for your students to complete.
